Requirements: Laborers will work 40 hrs/wk unless noted otherwise. Applicants must be at least 18 years of age before date of hire. Applicants must possess a valid driver's license with an insurable driving history. Starting wage for public works/parks department laborers is \$12.00/hr.

Requirements: Summer Customer Service Assistants, Lifeguards, and Recreation Facility Janitorial must be at least 16 years of age, and all other positions must be at least 18 years of age, before date of hire. Applicants must possess a valid driver's license with an insurable driving history. Starting wage is \$10.00-12.00/hr depending on position. Hours may be weather-dependent.

How to Apply: Candidates must complete an online application at cityofspearfish.com, under the Career Opportunities link. This process includes creating a profile. Position descriptions are available online, and positions are open until filled. Individuals with disabilities who need reasonable accommodations to complete the job application process should contact the Human Resources Director to commence the accommodations interactive process.
